TRIBE REPORTS NO CONFIRMED CORONAVIRUS CASES ON RESERVATION
First confirmed case of coronavirus reported in Oneida Co.
Iron Co. (WI) & Gogebic Co. (MI), (not LDF) report patient coronavirus deaths

AS OF THIS UPDATE, 2pm, Friday, March 27, 2020: There are zero confirmed coronavirus cases on the Reservation. However, there are confirmations of the virus in Wisconsin's Vilas and Iron Counties as well as Gogebic County (MI). Iron Co. and Gogebic Co. report a patient dying related to coronavirus complications.

Oneida Co. (not in LDF) reports its first patient to test positive for coronavirus. We'll continue to share information as it is received. This information was shared with Tribal Council and our Emergency Response Team by the Oneida Co. Health Department.

To the extent possible, please remain calm. We expect more coronavirus confirmations. At this point, the virus has not arrived in LDF. Tribal Council and Tribal Emergency Response Team have been preparing for coronavirus arriving on the Reservation. Sadly, more reports are expected of people passing from the virus in nearby communities. We will share information as it is available. Social distancing (6ft). Staying at home. Handwashing and other health protocols are the best defense. **Please take Shelter-At-Home Declaration & Guidelines seriously at LDFTribe.com**

There are community members not observing the guidelines. We respectfully urge everyone—for the safety of our entire community—to Shelter-At-Home. If this virus reaches the Reservation, it likely will spread quickly. Limiting travel and interaction—now—can help reduce the spread. This includes limiting visits with family and friends. Even without symptoms, we can spread the virus.

Peter Christensen Health Center continues to prepare and carry out drills to prepare for coronavirus arriving here. **Unscheduled walk-in visits no longer allowed until further notice.** All patients must call (715) 588-3371 before visiting the clinic. We ask if patients have concerns they call first. We will discuss your situation and arrange care or testing if necessary. If you have chest pain or respiratory distress, dial 911.


LDF Transit Service suspended until further notice. The Tribe's No. 1 priority is safety and security of all who live, work and visit Lac du Flambeau. Thank you for your patience and sacrifices.

Smoke Shop closing until further notice at 9pm tonight. Please get supplies at Ojibwe Market.

LDF Tribal Police have the ability to fine those not observing Shelter-At-Home guidelines. Police have been stopping people and vehicles on the Reservation. Most have resulted in explanations on why it is important to Shelter-At-Home. No one wants to issue fines for not observing the Shelter-At-Home declaration. But, as we are seeing in news reports, the coronavirus has arrived in Vilas, Iron and Gogebic Co. Police are helping to reduce the spread of this virus, which we expect to arrive on the Reservation eventually. Please follow the Shelter-At-Home guidelines.

We're fixing the coronavirus hotline number to ensure delivery of recorded messages. We are aware (715) 588-4300 has malfunctioned, hanging up on callers. Once fixed, we will update all. Thank you for your patience as we continue to offer information on several channels to keep everyone informed. Please visit LDFTribe.com for all the information shared by the Tribe.
