**ZERO CONFIRMED CORONAVIRUS CASES ON RESERVATION**  
**Oneida Co. Health (not in LDF) confirms one coronavirus case is a 20-year-old**

**AS OF THIS UPDATE, 12pm, Saturday, March 28, 2020:** LDF has no confirmed coronavirus cases. Vilas, Oneida and Iron Counties report confirmed cases. Statistics show 1-in-5 virus-related hospitalizations involve patients 20-to-40 years old. That's 20 percent of hospitalizations.

**Younger people may not feel symptoms, but they can still spread coronavirus to others.** Coronavirus spreads easily. It quickly infects many others. Please stay at home to protect those most vulnerable. Many you will never meet, but you could kill them if exposed to coronavirus.

**Coronavirus testing continues in Lac du Flambeau.** Twelve tests have been administered at the Peter Christensen Health Center. Nine test returned negative. Three tests are out for lab analysis. We will keep everyone updated as test results return.

**If you visited areas where coronavirus cases have been confirmed, Tribal Members should** call the clinic and ask for community health during normal business hours at (715) 588-3371. If after hours, please contact Dave Poupart at (715) 439-3971.

**Tribal Members authorized to exercise off-reservation Treaty Rights.** Please observe social distancing and health guidelines. **Health agencies report Wisconsin and the United States expect rise in coronavirus cases.** Shelter-At-Home declarations by Tribal, State and Local governments will take time to take effect. If people ignore stay-at-home guidelines, it will take longer to see the slowing of the coronavirus.

**Unscheduled walk-in visits to the clinic no longer allowed until further notice.** All patients must call (715) 588-3371 before visiting the clinic. For chest pain or respiratory distress, dial 911.


